

THIS MORNING'S ORGAN MUSIC: Amongst his prolific compositional output, Johannes Brahms (1833-1897) is probably least-known for his organ music. Apart from several smaller organ works composed early in his career, he wrote nothing for the organ until the last year of his life. His set of *Eleven Chorale Preludes, Op. 122*, finished in May and June of 1896, just ten months before his death, would be the last music from his pen. This morning we hear his setting of the gentle Advent chorale *Lo, how a Rose e'er blooming*. The 8:30 Offertory offers music from J.S. Bach's (1685-1750) *Pastorale*. Unlike the German model of the same name, which intended to evoke moods of nature, Bach modeled the Italian *pastorali*, meant to provide pious and naïve music in honor of the Christ Child. For hundreds of years, shepherds from the Italian country fields would flock to Rome during the Christmas season to play on their *shawms* and other simple instruments in the streets before the altars of the Virgin and Child—a custom which prevailed until motor traffic made it impossible. This morning we hear the second section of Bach's quadpartite *Pastorale*.
