IN GRATEFUL RESPONSE to the grace of God, this community of Christ's Church gathers regularly for worship, study and discernment, and then disperses to carry the love of Jesus Christ into the community and the world beyond these walls. We invite you to lend your own gifts and abilities to our journey of faith together at University Presbyterian Church.

OUR WORSHIPPING FAMILY OF FAITH INCLUDES CHILDREN of all ages. Through our excellent childcare program, Sunday morning childcare is available during both worship services for infants, toddlers and preschool children, who will be welcomed by our trained nursery staff and parent volunteers. We strive to provide skilled caregivers to accommodate any special needs. Infants are welcome to remain in the Sanctuary with parents; however, the parlor (located alongside the narthex) is a wonderful place for parents to calm an anxious baby. A special part of our morning service is the Time with Children, when they are invited to join the pastor on the chancel steps for a message that connects the worship of the day with their unique understanding. If children are new to this experience of coming forward, parents can join them. After the Time with Children, parents of those four years and younger are invited to take their children downstairs to the nurseries (through the door nearest the baptismal font). ## Worship Notes

**THIS MORNING'S MUSIC:** In 1750, Johann Sebastian Bach (1685-1750) set out to publish a collection of 18 chorale preludes, intending to illustrate, by providing large and significant examples, all the ways of arranging a chorale for organ. In the last weeks of his life, he revisited mostly previous material and provided other new compositions for this task, but died before he could finish. This morning's Voluntary is the last of three settings of *Nun Komm, der Heiden Heiland* (Come, Savior of the Nations) found in this collection known as *The Great Eighteen*. It is set as a *Fantasia* with the noble chorale tune heard in the pedals, accompanied by three-part counterpoint in the keyboards. The 8:30 Offering, *Chant de paix* (Song of Peace) is in the lush and sumptuous post-Impressionistic harmonic language of French organist and composer Jean Langlais (1907-1991). The 11:00 Anthem is from the pen of Edward C. Bairstow (1874-1946), organist of York Minster in England for thirty-three years from 1911 until his death. Notorious for his terse and brusque manner, he shocked the English musical establishment by refusing the invitation from Westminster Abbey to become its music director. *Let All Mortal Flesh Keep Silence* is his most famous anthem and was published in 1925. Its text dates from the late Fourth or early Fifth century and is from *The Liturgy of Saint James*, among the oldest Eucharistic liturgies in continuous use.

This favorite celebration of the season traces the story of the birth of our Lord through Lessons from the Old and New Testaments and with music of the season sung by all the choirs of University Church. We join with churches around the world in offering this service of scripture and music to celebrate Christ's birth.

**THE CHRISTMAS JOY OFFERING** of the Presbyterian Church (USA) will be received next Sunday, December 18. The offering will bring good news of great joy to the poor in circumstance or spirit. The offering envelopes are available in the pews today. This special offering provides the opportunity for future leaders of the church, from all racial and ethnic backgrounds, to pursue and fulfill their dreams through Presbyterian-related education. The offering also helps families of active and retired church workers meet unexpected needs through the Assistance Program of the Board of Pensions.

**PLEASE JOIN US ON CHRISTMAS EVE** (Saturday, December 24) for any of our three services. Christmas Eve starts with our 4 p.m. service. We invite children, youth, parents, grandparents and all others to this afternoon Christmas Eve worship service that will lift our spirit in the lively ringing of bells. This is a special worship experience intended especially for children and their families, giving us the opportunity to watch the nativity story unfold before our very eyes. The Junior and Children's Choirs will lead the music in this worship service. All are welcome to a more traditional 7 p.m. Candlelight Service with music led by our Youth Choir and to a Candlelight and Communion Service at 11 p.m. with music led by our Chancel Choir. Communion will be served by intinction.

**THE CHRISTMAS EVE OFFERING** will be received during each service on Saturday, December 24. The monies received from this special offering will be divided between the Pastor's Discretionary Fund and the Martin Luther King, Jr. Scholarship Fund.

**ON CHRISTMAS DAY** (Sunday, December 25), the congregation and community are invited to gather at UPC for one regular worship service at 11:00 a.m. We will not have an 8:30 service on this day. There will be no Sunday morning childcare for infants, toddlers or preschool-aged children on Christmas Day or New Year's Day, Sunday, January 1, so our nursery workers may enjoy these holidays with their families. As always, children are welcome to remain in worship with their parents. Regular Sunday morning childcare will resume on January 8.
