OUR WORSHIPPING FAMILY OF FAITH INCLUDES CHILDREN of all ages. Worship Notes

IN TODAY'S OPENING HYMN, we sing a line that says, "Gladly for aye we adore him." In this instance, "aye" means "ever" or "always," and is pronounced with a long "a" – āy. When used as a word of assent, "aye" is pronounced like "eye."

THIS MORNING'S ORGAN MUSIC is from the pen of Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart (1756-1791), baptized as Johannes Chrysostomus Wolfgangus Theophilus Mozart. Even before the 'official' end of the Baroque period, marked by the death of J.S. Bach in 1750, a new musical style was emerging that turned away from the Baroque esthetic to espouse qualities of clarity, simplicity and balance. This new *Classical* movement virtually abandoned the 'antique' instruments of the Baroque in favor of the newly-developing piano, and although many of the leading composers of the period were church organists in their youth, an impressive list that included Clementi, Mozart, Haydn and Beethoven, among many others, none of them composed any significant music especially for solo organ. This morning's Voluntary was originally composed for the Glass Harmonica, an instrument consisting of a set of rotating bowls partially submerged in water and played by the fingertips, invented in 1761 by Benjamin Franklin (1706-1790). The Offertory music, Mozart's *Andante K. 67*, was composed in 1772 when he was the organist of the cathedral in Salzburg, Austria. It is from the first of seventeen *Church Sonatas* written for organ, strings and other instruments intended to be played between the reading of the Epistle and Gospel during the Mass. All of the music of Mozart we hear this morning was arranged for solo organ by E. Power Biggs (1906-1977). "Amadeus" was born 261 years ago this coming week on January 27, 1751.
