

IN GRATEFUL RESPONSE to the grace of God, this community of Christ's Church gathers regularly for worship, study and discernment, and then disperses to carry the love of Jesus Christ into the community and the world beyond these walls. We invite you to lend your own gifts and abilities to our journey of faith together at University Presbyterian Church.

OUR WORSHIPING FAMILY OF FAITH INCLUDES CHILDREN of all ages. Through our excellent childcare program, Sunday morning childcare is available during both worship services for infants, toddlers and preschool children, who will be welcomed by our trained nursery staff and parent volunteers. We strive to provide skilled caregivers to accommodate any special needs. Infants are welcome to remain in the Sanctuary with parents; however, the parlor (located alongside the narthex) is a wonderful place for parents to calm an anxious baby. A special part of our morning service is the Time with Children, when they are invited to join the pastor on the chancel steps for a message that connects the worship of the day with their unique understanding. If children are new to this experience of coming forward, parents can join them. After the Time with Children, parents of those four years and younger are invited to take their children downstairs to the nurseries (through the door nearest the baptismal font). DURING THE 11:00 A.M. WORSHIP SERVICE, UPC offers Godly Play for kindergarteners and children who are age four (as of September 1). Following the Time with Children, kindergarteners and four-year-olds go with the Godly Play Assistant through the door to the left of the pulpit to the Godly Play room. Younger children exit through the door near the parking lot and baptismal font.

Worship Notes

THIS MORNING'S ORGAN VOLUNTARY and 11:00 Choral Offering hail from the pen of Franz Josef Haydn (1732-1809). Born of humble birth in rural Austria, Haydn would grow to become celebrated as the greatest living composer of his generation. He began his musical career at the age of eight as a choirboy at St. Stephen's Cathedral in Vienna; his tenure there ended abruptly when he snipped off the ponytail of a fellow chorister as a prank. After a thrashing, he was literally put out onto the street which began, as he later described, his "horrible existence." Even as young man, Haydn was hugely industrious: In addition to teaching, accompanying and other freelance musical activities, he worked as a valet and held jobs at three different churches on Sunday mornings, playing the violin at the first at 8:00, the organ at the second at 10:00, and singing at still another at 11:00! Haydn was the last important composer to enjoy royal patronage, which freed his artistic spirit to compose 106 symphonies (he would become known as *The Father of the Symphony*), 77 string quartets, 62 piano sonatas, a variety of instrumental music, masses, operas, and an oratorio. Like most composers in the Classical period, Haydn forsook the organ and harpsichord in favor of the then-new (and secular) piano, and composed no organ music apart from some small pieces for "organ clocks" which were then popular. This morning's Voluntary presents six such pieces, composed in 1792 for a famous public clock in Vienna; the pieces were played automatically on a small organ operated by the clock mechanism. This morning's 11:00 Choral Offering is a chorus from Haydn's Oratorio "Die Schöpfung" (*The Creation*), a large work for soloists, chorus and orchestra. Haydn worked on it for nearly two years (1796-98) and later remarked "I was never so devout as when I was at work on *The Creation*; I fell on my knees each day and begged God to give me the strength to finish the work!" Haydn's Oratorio casts three soloists as the Archangels Gabriel, Uriel, and Raphael who narrate and comment on the successive six days of creation; monumental choruses are interspersed throughout the work, including this morning's which celebrates the end of the fourth day of creation (when God made the sun, moon, and stars). The 8:30 Offertory presents music from Haydn's young friend Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart (1756-1791).
