

Worship Notes

THIS MORNING'S ORGAN VOLUNTARY is from the pen of the influential Belgian organist, composer and teacher Flor Peeters (1903-1986). He was the Director of the Antwerp Conservatory and would preside at the organ of St. Rumbold's Cathedral in Mechelen for sixty-three years until his death. He was also only one of three musicians ever to be made a Baron by the King of Belgium. His Aria, Op. 51, heard this morning, is firmly based in the jazz idiom and is in fact his own transcription of the slow movement of his Sonata for Trumpet. This morning's OFFERTORY is a portion of César Franck's (1822-1890) Grande Pièce Symphonique, a large-scale, single-movement work taken from his Six Pièces, Op. 17. It was written after the disastrous failure of Franck's opera, a disappointment which paralyzed Franck's activity as a composer for several years. It would be the influence of the wonderful new Cavaillé-Coll organ at Sainte-Clotilde in Paris, to which he was appointed the new church's first organist in 1859, that encouraged him to resume composing. The link between this morning's two composers comes through Franck's successor at St. Clotilde, Charles Tournamire (1870-1939) who, in 1933, altered and enlarged the organ such that it required a new console. Tournamire kept Franck's organ console (which he referred to as his 'relic') in his Paris apartment until his death and in his will bequeathed it to Flor Peeters. The French, however, aware of the console's significance, wanted it to stay in France. Ultimately, it was with the help of the American Army chaplains in Brussels that an army truck was dispatched to Paris and the priceless 'relic' was delivered to Peeters in Belgium, where it stood in his office at the Antwerp Conservatory. In accordance with Peeters' will, the console was given to Antwerp's Vleeshuis Museum, where it can still be seen. It was my privilege to visit César Franck's grave in Paris during my sabbatical last summer.
