

From Margaret's Statement of Faith: "I trust that the same God who called to the child Samuel, provided for the stranger Ruth, brought life from aged Sarah, and knit once hapless disciples into the body of Christ, continues to seek, nourish, and send the Church today. By the stirring of the Holy Spirit, God comes to us in the most ordinary circumstances: in the wonder of creation, in the "otherness" of strangers, in the friction and ease of life together. As we wrestle with scripture, are washed at the font and fed at the table, and then loose our peculiar offerings in the world, God makes more of us than we ever imagined we might be.

The Presbyterian Church is home to me; it is the family that loved me into life. Though we can be a fractious and distracted community, I am convinced that God wastes no offering we bring in trust. When we are most faithful, we come expectantly to scripture, hoping to encounter the Living Word in ancient words. We remember that discernment and the exercise of power are shared responsibilities, and that the Spirit's leading often comes from beyond comfortable centers of power. We are engaged in the world in solidarity with all who suffer, and we challenge each other to be faithful stewards of all that God has entrusted to our care. I am grateful for the witness and the love I have known in this corner of Christ's church."

What Comes Next

Between moving and preparing for the call, it will be a busy summer for Margaret! With an anticipated starting date of September 5th, Margaret will work with the program staff to determine an appropriate onboarding process, including introductory meetings with staff, Session, and the entire congregation.

Margaret's plan will be to join the Congregational Retreat September 8-10. Her first Sunday in the pulpit is planned for September 17th.
