CARING FOR ALL

UPC's **Stephen Ministry** and **Mental Health Task Force** expand services to our hurting brothers and sisters. In 25 years, UPC has trained over 100 Stephen Ministers to provide one-to-one spiritual care by listening, encouraging and praying with members facing hardships. UPC is living into its pledge to be a WISE (welcoming, inclusive, supportive and engaged) congregation for mental health through adult Sunday School classes, youth and family programs, resource and referral information, and partnerships with Faith Connections on Mental Illness and the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI).







Almost 100 children and over 80 volunteers gathered at Camp New Hope for Vacation Bible School in June. Through storytelling, crafts, music, service and recreation, participants explored the theme, "Digging for Treasure: Parables Revealed."

GROWING TOGETHER

UPC's education programming gives children, youth and adults space to examine questions of faith and to nurture a deeper relationship with God. Sunday School classes, Godly Play, Bible studies, Presbyterian Women circles, and Vacation Bible School provide regular opportunities for faith formation for God's children of all ages. With two staff educators, UPC now offers annual congregational retreats, Kirk Club, and a Back to School worship service. Our Young Adult Gatherings, Woman to Woman and Men's Breakfast discussion groups are thriving.



Adults serve as Sunday School teachers for all ages and as Confirmation mentors for youth. Through teaching and learning, the Spirit binds us together as a church family, and God's story is shared and lived.

Thoughtful sermons and exquisite music touch our hearts and minds in worship. The **Chancel Choir** provides inspired music throughout the liturgical calendar, with a repertoire that spans seven centuries. The **Youth**, **Junior** and **Children's Choirs** add joy to worship and present outstanding musical productions each year. June 2017 marked the 30th summer that UPC choirs have attended the **Montreat Worship and Music Conference**.

UPC hosts and supports **Presbyterian Campus Ministry**, a thriving program where UNC students grow in their faith and often continue to spread the Good News upon graduation.


POWERFUL PROMISE


UPC'S 2017 OPERATING BUDGET
