THIS MORNING'S ORGAN VOLUNTARY is from the pen of French organist and composer Marcel Dupré (1886-1971). Destined to become one of the greatest organists of the Twentieth Century, Dupré began his career in church music at the age of twelve, when he was appointed organist at the church of St. Vivien in Rouen, France. After initial studies with his father, he became a student at the Paris *Conservatoire*, where he studied with Alexandre Guilmant and Charles-Marie Widor. He served for a time as Louis Vierne's assistant at the Cathedral of Notre Dame, and, in 1906, he was appointed Widor's assistant at the church of St. Sulpice (of *The DaVinci Code* fame) in Paris; upon Widor's retirement in 1934, Dupré succeeded Widor and remained in that post until his death in 1971. Between them, the two organists served St. Sulpice for 101 years! In 1920, Dupré was the first organist ever to perform the complete works (just over 300) of Bach in concert from memory, and he would eventually edit his own edition of the complete works of Bach—both extraordinary feats of virtuosity. Dupré's improvisations were legendary, and many of his compositions were first heard as improvisations, including this morning's Voluntary. It utilizes the Gregorian theme *Placare Christe servulis* (the Gregorian chant appointed for use on All Saints') in dialogue between the soprano and bass (pedals) voices supported by a dazzling accompaniment.

On RSVVP (Restaurants Sharing Ten Percent) Day, participating restaurants contribute 10 percent of their total proceeds (from breakfast, lunch, dinner, and in-between snacks) to benefit the Inter-Faith Council's FoodFirst food programs: Food Pantry and Community Kitchen. Last year 103 restaurants and their customers raised more than \$24,000 for IFC hunger-relief programs, bringing the 28-year total to more than \$500,000. The 2017 goal is to raise \$25,000.
