



## Worship Notes

THIS MORNING'S ORGAN MUSIC offers two movements from François Couperin's (1668-1733) *Messe pour les Paroisses* (Mass for the Parishes), a collection of 21 pieces based on Gregorian melodies from the *Missa cunctipotens genitor Deus* (Mass of the Omnipotent God). This music was intended to be played alternately with the sung portions of the service so the choir could have an occasional rest; it also enhanced the grandeur of the High Mass with the organ's voice. When the choir didn't sing, the organ would provide music based (often loosely) on the chant the choir would have sung. That seemed to be enough to satisfy liturgical requirements for the Mass to be valid. Although the greatest organists of the day would improvise this music, Couperin's *Mass for the Parishes* was a practical resource for organists who did not possess improvisatory skills. This morning's Voluntary is taken from the *Agnus Dei* (Lamb of God) portion of the Mass. The chant that would have been sung by the choir is at best briefly referred to here; only seven notes of the chant appointed for this part of the Mass are present, as the first three and last four notes in the pedal. This music was intended to be played during the *Elevation*, the most sublime moment in the Mass where the consecrated elements were held up so the people could see and contemplate them. The doleful mood of this piece underscores the solemnity of its intention. This morning's 8:30 Offertory is from the *Kyrie* (Lord have mercy) portion of Couperin's *Messe*, and uses the first eight notes of the Gregorian Chant as the subject (or theme) of this fugue.

## Budget Update

The 2018 stewardship campaign concludes soon as Session prepares to finalize UPC's budget at its February 15 meeting. **As of January 31, the total pledged for 2018 trails the final amounts pledged for each of the previous two years by almost \$93,000.** Because the church's budget is determined primarily by stewardship pledges received to date, Session was presented with preliminary budget scenarios at its January meeting containing limited staff cost-of-living adjustments and significant program cuts, including to Local and Global Outreach, campus ministry, music and youth programs, church retreats, and other programs and ministries. There is still time to positively impact the budget. If you have not yet pledged for 2018, **please do so now.** If you have already pledged, please consider increasing your pledge if you are able. Pledge cards are in the narthex and may be placed in the offering plate or mailed to UPC at P.O. Box 509, Chapel Hill, NC 27514. ## Mission Study Team Update

A Mission Study Team was appointed by Session to organize a gathering of information about the state of our church and to discern God's leading in this community. The Mission Study process is required for congregations during interim seasons, especially following the ministry of a long-serving and much-loved pastor. Our process will likely include conversations, a questionnaire or survey, some town hall-style meetings, and some small-group meetings. You can find more information in the "Important Session Update" article in the February edition of *The Chimes*, and we will share more in the next few weeks – through our UPC website, the *Weekly E-News*, the bulletin, and *The Chimes*. ## Inclement-Weather Policy Update

On January 11, the Session voted to alter our inclement weather policy regarding Sunday morning worship. Under the new policy, if wintry weather leads us to cancel Sunday School Classes, we also will cancel the 8:30 worship service on that day. By 7:15 a.m. on the day in question, we will have news of the cancellation posted prominently on the church's website and on Facebook, and we will have updated the church's phone message to reflect the cancellation. We also hope to have the cancellation included on local TV stations' newscasts. Barring the most extreme weather events, we will continue to hold worship at 11:00 a.m.

## Souper Bowl of Caring: Today

The Souper Bowl of Caring began over 25 years ago with a simple prayer from a single youth group: "Lord, even as we enjoy the Super Bowl football game, help us be mindful of those without a bowl of soup to eat." Today, Kirk Club youth will take part in this national effort to love our neighbors. They will hold soup pots at the Sanctuary doors following both worship services to collect money for those who are hungry and hurting. In 2017, groups participating in the Souper Bowl of Caring generated over \$10.1 million in cash and food items. None of the money is sent to Souper Bowl headquarters and will instead be donated locally to TABLE and Inter-Faith Council. Please drop your dollar in the soup pot as you leave worship today.
