UPC's 30-Second Elevator Pitch

The Farm Church pastors shared <u>their elevator pitch</u> with us during the Fall 2017 Congregational retreat *Good Soil*.

An elevator pitch is a clear, brief message or "commercial." It communicates who UPC is, what UPC is looking for, and how UPC can do God's work to transform the world around us. An elevator pitch is typically about 30 seconds, the time it takes people to ride from the top to the bottom of a building in an elevator. (The idea behind having an elevator speech is that you are prepared to share this information with anyone, at anytime, even in an elevator.)

Think for a moment about having to give an elevator pitch about UPC and what it means to you.

Your pitch should be 75 to 100 words.
