Confirmation Classes

Youth in 8th grade are invited to be a part of the Confirmation class during the Sunday School hour each year. This class covers a variety of topics that help youth explore their faith in the context of becoming church members. They learn basic tenets of what the Presbyterian Church (USA) believes and are encouraged to decide for themselves the aspects of their faith they hold dear. This class culminates with each youth writing their own Statement of Faith and sharing it with the UPC Session just before they are confirmed before the congregation.

History of the Church



A Presbyterian church has stood at this location since 1849, when the first building was completed on a one-acre lot purchased from the University of North Carolina. Since then, a number of additions and renovations have been needed, including the rebuilding of our Sanctuary after a devastating fire in 1958. Our present Sanctuary was dedicated in 1962.

Today, our church's commitment to the university remains strong in a vibrant campus ministry, but membership and mission have widened to include the entire Chapel Hill community. Our congregation represents an exciting mix of townspeople from Chapel Hill, Carrboro, and the Research Triangle area, and a growing number of both young adults and retirees.
