

IN GRATEFUL RESPONSE to the grace of God, this community of Christ's Church gathers regularly for worship, study and discernment, and then disperses to carry the love of Jesus Christ into the community and the world beyond these walls. We invite you to join us on the journey.

OUR WORSHIPING FAMILY OF FAITH INCLUDES CHILDREN of all ages. Through our excellent childcare program, Sunday morning childcare is available during both worship services for infants, toddlers and preschool children, who will be welcomed by our trained nursery staff. ## Worship Notes

THIS MORNING'S VOLUNTARY is one of Bach's greatest Advent chorale preludes. *Nun komm', der Heiden Heiland* (Come, Savior of the nations) is based on the tune adapted from a plainsong (Gregorian chant) melody first found in the *Einsiedeln Hymnal* of the twelfth or thirteenth century; the form of the melody Bach uses in this work was included in the *Erfurt Enchiridia*, 1542. The text is one of twelve definitely ascribed to Ambrose (340-397). As with many Advent hymns of the period, *Nun komm'* is cast in a minor key, symbolic of the juxtaposition of the joyous anticipation of Christ's birth and the inevitability of the cross. This setting is particularly famous for Bach's use of a 'walking bass' line, suggesting Christ's footsteps to Calvary. The highly ornamented (and thus 'veiled' or disguised) melody has been interpreted as being "expressive of the impenetrable mystery of the Incarnation of God's Son." The 8:30 Offertory music offers a simple setting of *Nun komm'* taken from Bach's *Orgelbüchlein* (Little Organ Book).

CONTINUING THE CONVERSATION...The work of proclamation belongs not just to preachers but to the Christian community as a whole. To that end, if thoughts or questions are stimulated by a sermon that you hear, your worship leaders would be grateful to receive your reflections. While we are always open to face-to-face conversation, sometimes it's easier to drop a note by email. We can't promise to respond to each email individually, but we would love to have your thoughts and questions inform our preparation for worship in the weeks to come.
