OUR WORSHIPING FAMILY OF FAITH INCLUDES CHILDREN of all ages. Through our excellent childcare program, Sunday morning childcare is available during both worship services for infants, toddlers and preschool children, who will be welcomed by our trained nursery staff. We strive to provide skilled caregivers to accommodate any special needs. Infants are welcome to remain in the Sanctuary with parents; however, the parlor (located alongside the narthex) is a wonderful place for parents to calm an anxious baby. A special part of our service is the Time with Children, when they are invited to come to the front of the Sanctuary for a message that connects the worship of the day with their unique understanding. If children are new to this experience of coming forward, parents can join them. After the Time with Children, parents of those four years and younger are invited to take their children downstairs to the nurseries (through the door nearest the baptismal font). Following the Time with Children, kindergartners and four-year-olds go with the Godly Play Assistant through the door to the left of the pulpit to the Godly Play room. Younger children exit through the door near the parking lot and baptismal font.

THIS MORNING'S ORGAN MUSIC, two settings of *Allein Gott in der Höh sei Ehr* (All Glory be to God on High) by Johann Sebastian Bach (1685-1750), is based on the famous hymn tune adapted by Nikolaus Decius (1490?-1541) from the tenth-century Gregorian Chant. In the mysterious and wondrous workings of the church, this great hymn of Christmas, which is the song the angels sang at the birth of Jesus, was in fact taken from the Gregorian Chant appointed for the Mass for Easter Day. This morning's Voluntary offers a profound and highly ornamented setting in A Major, a key often attributed as the "Grail tonality" by romantic theorists, and which projects a great sense of awe and wonder. Further symbolism includes an ornamented descending pattern, first heard at the very beginning of this work, which represents 'bringing heaven down to earth,' and which is woven into the bass or one of the inner parts throughout this setting. The 8:30 Offertory presents another setting for keyboards alone, taken from Bach's *Clavierübung III* collection. The lively nature of this setting might suggest angelic acrobatics celebrating the birth of Jesus. *Allein Gott* was clearly a favorite hymn of Bach: over his lifetime he used it more than any other, ultimately composing ten different works based on the tune.

CONTINUING THE CONVERSATION...The work of proclamation belongs not just to preachers but to the Christian community as a whole. ## 2019 Stewardship Campaign

Thank you for your outpouring of generosity to our 2019 Stewardship campaign to bear fruit that will last. We are making progress in closing the gap between pledges for 2019 and our 2018 church budget. The average pledge has increased, but the number of pledges has lagged. As of January 10, we were about \$108,000 behind the amount needed to fund last year's reduced budget, and \$134,000 behind amounts pledged in 2016 and 2017.
