Children's & Youth Ministries

University Presbyterian Preschool (UPPS): UPPS is a half-day early childhood program serving two to five-year-old children.

Sunday School for Children: Classes for children (birth through 5th grade) are offered September through May from 9:45 - 10:45 a.m.

Vacation Bible School (VBS): VBS takes place for one week each summer in the morning at New Hope Camp and Conference Center and is open to all children ages three years through rising 5th grade (grade the child will enter in the fall).

Pastoral Care

Pastoral Care: It is a privilege for our church family to listen, pray, and be present with you when in need. The Deacons, pastors, and program staff are available to offer care and support.

Stephen Ministry: Lay caregivers provide oneto-one care to those in need, addressing all of life's transitions. Stephen Ministers are trained to listen and all meetings are confidential. Meeting with a Stephen Minister might be a one-time thing or might continue for a period of time.

A Brief History of UPC



A Presbyterian church has stood at this location since 1849. Since then, a number of additions and renovations have been accomplished, including the rebuilding of our Sanctuary after a fire in 1958. Our present Sanctuary was dedicated in 1962. The most recent additions to the building include Vance Barron Hall, completed in 1999, and Dunham Hall, which was dedicated in 2017.
