

THIS MORNING'S ORGAN MUSIC is from the pen of famous French organist and composer Jean Langlais (1907-1991), a student of Marcel Dupré (1886-1971) and organist of the Basilica of St. Clotilde in Paris, a post once held by César Franck (1882-1890). Langlais, who was blind from birth, was encouraged to pursue the organ, as were many blind musicians in France; Louis Vierne (1870-1937), the celebrated organist of the Cathedral of Notre Dame in Paris, was another. A career as an organist was thought to be ideal as it was something that blind persons could do effectively on their own, without help or guidance. Indeed, even today one of the four organists at the Cathedral of Notre Dame is without sight. Despite his physical challenge, Jean Langlais developed himself into one of the premier concert organists and composers of the second half of the twentieth century and developed a remarkable and unique harmonic language. This morning's Voluntary, *Chant de paix*, is a simple and elegant example of his luxurious and evocative style. During my first trip to Paris, as a college Junior in 1974, it was my privilege to meet Jean Langlais and be with him in the organ loft of St. Clotilde one Sunday morning as he played the Mass.
