Ministry of Hope – Lesotho

Care for orphans and children in Lesotho



The Ministry of Hope Lesotho was founded in 2009 by PC(USA) Missionary Nancy Dimmock in collaboration with Mamonyane Mohale, a Lesotho health care professional. For some years prior to that time, UPC had been a supporter of Nancy and her husband Frank Dimmock, PC [USA] missionaries to Africa. The Dimmocks are now back in the US leading an African Outreach Foundation, but Mamonyane Mohale, Nancy's colleague, continues to direct the program in Lesotho, Africa. The Government Street Presbyterian Church of Mobile, Alabama now leads a group of Presbyterian churches that support this project.



The Ministry of Hope works today **primarily with orphaned children and provides them with physical care, shelter, food and clothing.** Many of the children who live at the center there have become orphans as a result of the HIV/AIDS pandemic, **exacerbated now by the serious spread of the COVID virus in Lesotho.** Some children have been sent to the center at the Ministry of Hope because of abuse, neglect and sometimes even voluntary transfers from severely impoverished African families unable to provide basic necessities for their children. The goal of the work at the Ministry of Hope is **to nurture the health of the children** before returning them to their families or placing them with Lesotho families who adopt them.
