

Pastor's Message



There's a quote from "Mister" Fred Rogers that seems to pop up more and more in recent years: "When I was a boy and I would see scary things in the news, my mother would say to me, 'Look for the helpers. You will always find people who are helping.""

It saddens me to see how often *scary things in the news* lead people to re-post this quote from the Presbyterian Church's most famous pastor. The news out of Israel and Gaza is but the most recent example that peace is ever-elusive and security is never guaranteed. By grace and the Spirit's grit, the world is full of helpers, and I want to invite you to meet some of them.

The Global Outreach committee is hosting a number of these *helpers* for a Sunday morning class so you can meet them and learn a bit more about how they are contributing to the healing of the world. By the time you read this, our first presenter will have already come – Dr. Karla Koll teaches at the **Latin American Biblical University in Sao Jose, Costa Rica** where she offers instruction to pastors and missionaries who are dispersed all across Central America, encouraging them to be thoughtful in their approach to mission and to seek solutions to community problems from within the communities they serve.

On November 5, Kathy Walmer will join us from **Family Health Ministries** and speak about the important work of bringing health and prenatal care as well as birthing services to women and children in rural Haiti. The next Sunday, we will hear from another partner, Pastor Leon D'Orleans of **Haiti Outreach Ministries**, who provides much-needed education, healthcare, and spiritual worship to the more urban corners of Haiti where much of the gang violence has taken place in recent months. On November 19, we have one more partner working within Haiti; Emily Everett from **Hearts with Haiti** will share about their work supporting Wings of Hope, a home for children and adults who experience a disability of some kind, among a variety of other services. Finally, on November 26, Sally Harwood will introduce us to the work of supporting orphaned children at the **Ministry of Hope in Lesotho**.

If bad news is most often what we hear from the world, I do invite you to tune in for some good news and learn more about the good work that is happening in some extremely troubled corners of the world, work that UPC has supported for many years, or decades in some cases.

Afterwards, the Global Outreach committee invites you to respond by taking part in the annual **Alternative Gift Market** (AGM). The AGM allows you to honor a family member or a friend with a gift, but a gift that directly contributes to the important work that these helpers are doing across the world. While there is not a precise line from each of these presenters to the ministries highlighted in the AGM, the hope is that hearing from these helpers will inspire you to be generous.

"Look for the helpers," Fred Rogers said. Far be it from me to edit the words of my childhood-television icon, but implicit to the spirit of Fred Rogers as well as the spirit of God is an invitation to not only look for the helpers but to become one yourself. May God find us ready to respond with all that we have and all that we are.

Sunday Morning Classes for Adults (9:45 am)

Dunham Hall Class: *The Ties that Bind: Handing on the Faith from Generation to Generation* (Nov. 5 & 12)

This is a workshop for parents and grandparents exploring evidence-based practices for transmitting the faith to children. Research continues to show that parents are the single most important influence on children's faith as they grow into young adulthood. Grandparents also play a more important role than ever. Come to this workshop led by Rick Osmer to learn and practice strategies parents and grandparents can use in their daily lives.

This class will be led by Richard Osmer, a retired professor from Princeton Theological Seminary who taught Christian formation and evangelism for thirty years. He is an ordained pastor of the Presbyterian Church (PCUSA), a UNC alum, and part of our UPC family.

From the Earth Care Team

Members of the UPC Earth Care Team dug hundreds of sweet potatoes at The Garden at Spring Forest on Saturday, September 30, 2023. It was hard, rewarding work enjoyed by grade-schoolers, PCM students, and older adults alike. The Garden uses regenerative agricultural practices which help combat climate change by removing carbon from the atmosphere and sequestering in the soil.

The Church at Spring Forest is a United Methodist faith community. Their ministries focus on regenerative farming, supporting refugee resettlement, contemplative and healing spirituality, and fostering the nutritional and spiritual well-being of their neighbors.



The Garden at Spring Forest grows organic produce for the church's Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) project which helps to fund their mission of providing healthy produce to several food banks and refugee resettlement centers. UPC is a distribution site for weekly CSA boxes. Several UPC families pick up a weekly box of locally grown, farm fresh vegetables. 

About the film:

The Chapel Hill-Carrboro City Schools gained notoriety in 2016 when news broke that the "achievement gap" between white and Black students was among the widest in the nation. In fact, the disenfranchisement of Black children has been occurring ever since schools were formally integrated. While the district has pursued some initiatives to address racial inequities, the stratified educational system still fails many students of color. *I'm Smart, Too* explores how the seeds of the disparities are cultivated in the early grades and the lasting impact of these experiences.
