
A Guide for Planning a Memorial Service



In life and in death, we belong to God. This is the promise of our faith.

Nothing can separate us from the love of God in Jesus Christ, not even death.

This is why we call the memorial service a Witness to the Resurrection. In it, we cling to the hope of new life and unconquerable love, and in it, we celebrate the life and story of the specific and unique child of God that we so deeply grieve. We never love in the abstract, always in the particular. God does too.



Planning the Service

When a death occurs, your pastors want to be present and are here to guide you in planning a service. The 24-hour on-call number is 919-929-2102, extension 133. UPC will provide the pastor(s), music, bulletin, guest book, and hospitality (ushers and volunteers).

Music

Congregational song is central to the worship of God as the community gathers to celebrate a saint's life. Singing allows the community to "do something" in support of the grieving, it embodies our theology, connecting us to the promises of our faith, and it helps to unleash our grief, opening us to God's healing presence. Suggested hymns are listed on p. 4.

Other special music can be coordinated with our Director of Music; such musicians require an honorarium of \$200.

Livestreaming

We are able to livestream memorial services upon request, viewed at upcch.org/live. Afterward we will share a link to the recording with the family.

If the family chooses to livestream the service, the church will secure an individual to run the tech, and an \$100 honorarium is expected to be paid directly to that person.

Flowers

Family may provide flowers for the service. These will be also used for the reception to follow. Family may take the arrangement home following. Flowers for either the service and/or the reception are not required.

If the service is on a Saturday, and the family would like to have the family-provided flowers grace both the memorial and Sunday morning worship, please let the church office know so that we may make a note in the bulletin. Such flowers would then be delivered to homebound members by deacons following Sunday worship.



The UPC Deacons will gladly provide a reception following the service, typically in the Fellowship Hall. Punch, small sandwiches, and cookies are provided.

A memory table is often set up for pictures and memorabilia. A family provided laptop with a slide show can be connected to a TV in the reception space.



Interment

Burial, cremation, or donation of the body for medical purposes are all appropriate options within the Christian tradition. The body or cremains may be interred prior to or following the service.

Memorial Garden

UPC has a beautiful memorial garden where cremated remains of members (and their families) are interred at no charge. If your loved one does not have a reservation form on file with the church office, please fill out a request form (available in the office or on our website).

No urns or special containers are used. The committal service in the garden generally occurs with family-only a half an hour before the memorial service. Names of the saints are engraved on the granite panels twice a year.



Caskets

If a casket is brought to the church, it will be closed at all times during the memorial service. UPC has a pall for your use - a white piece of cloth (the color symbolizing Easter and Baptism). Funeral home staff will be responsible for assisting the pallbearers in placing and removing the casket.



Parking

For memorial services, the UPC parking lot is reserved for family members and for senior/ADA parking.

Hourly parking options within walking distance are:

Memorial Gifts

Memorial gifts, in lieu of flowers, may be directed to University Presbyterian Church or the UPC Endowment Fund. UPC will send acknowledgments to the family and to the donor of the gift.

Honorariums

No honorariums are expected for UPC staff or volunteers. This is what the church is here for. If a family is moved by gratitude, or eager to give glory to God, gifts are gladly accepted if made out to University Presbyterian Church and will be used to continue our call to live out God's love that is unstoppable even by death.

Honorariums for optional services are:

- Additional musicians for special music \$200 per musician
- Livestream tech \$100, paid directly to the individual
