Pastor's Message

Last week while I was eating lunch at Carolina Meadows with the ladies from Circle 2, someone jokingly said, “I think God is enjoying vacation; at least he only has to show up for one service in the summer.” Now, God doesn’t vacate our lives—ever—but I am grateful that built into the rhythm of creation is rest, and I pray you all have gotten some this summer. When things lie fallow, God makes room for new life.

I’ve seen that in our Memorial Garden. We completed the big waterproofing project last summer, and this past June we added a new granite wall under the bay window. Between these two projects, everything on the parlor side of the garden had to get ripped up. But in this disruption time, the Garden Committee has worked with a Master Gardener to create a new plan for planting and lighting, which we will implement in the fall when the ground is ready.

I want to tell you about another effort that has been quietly underway. Back in the fall, the Session commissioned a Vision Team to begin the work of discerning the shape of a possible future capital campaign. The team has met with representatives from internal groups—Property Committee, Administration Committee, Endowment Committee, and PCM—as well as hearing presentations from a number of our mission partners. We have also invited the input of a liturgical architect to help us refresh our space.

Right now, the group is split into three working groups. One is discerning how best to manage our money regarding our physical plant and planning for maintenance in the future (we’ll need a chiller soon). The second is working on our clear communication to the Session and to you, the congregation. And the third is working on what is needed in the Sanctuary (have you seen the paint peeling from the ceiling?) and what is hoped for in terms of a renovation of Vance Barron Hall (we anticipate transforming it into a Chapel with flexible seating).

I would imagine this team will recommend to the Session an upcoming capital campaign, perhaps beginning in 2025. This would mean our work would be completed in time to poise UPC for her next chapter of ministry—both within the walls and outside of them—in anticipation of our bicentennial in 2029.

In these dog-days of summer, as your own routine is disrupted and you are hopefully getting some rest, I wonder what God is working on in quiet, readying you for new life?

Alleluia Choir (Pre-K-5th grade): Sundays, 4:30-5:00 pm

The Alleluia Choir is a place for young children to sing the faith while learning music fundamentals. This choir sings twice a semester in worship and serves as a preparatory ensemble for the UPC Chorister Program. 3rd - 5th graders who are looking for an opportunity to sing with fewer commitments are welcome to continue singing and to serve as leaders in the Alleluia Choir.



UPC Choristers (3rd grade and older): Sundays, 4:30-5:15 pm

Welcome to Our New Music Scholars

In worship this past June, we bid farewell to Nuria Shin and Caroline Polito. Nuria, who was our soprano choral scholar from the fall of 2021 through the spring of 2023, graduated from UNC and will be pursuing a Masters of Music in opera at the University of Maryland in the fall. Caroline, who served the 2022-2023 academic year as our inaugural organ scholar music resident, will return to UNC where she has been admitted into the Masters of Public Health program and will be continuing work at the hospital. While both will be sorely missed, we wish them the best in the next chapters of their lives and give thanks for the ways they have enriched our music ministry at UPC.

This fall, we will welcome three new young artists (all sophomores at UNC) who will join our team, helping to lead worship while growing their skill sets in a sacred music context. Hania Kantzer will fill our Music Resident position while Annie Asher and Ethan Bunch will serve as choral scholars for the academic year. We are fortunate to have continued interest in these programs which has allowed for the selection of students who are not only dedicated musicians, but also good fits interpersonally and in character, aligning with the mission of our music ministry. Please read more about them below. We are also glad to welcome back alto Carrina Macaluso and bass Jackson Mosely for renewed appointments.

Choral scholars are voice students from the UNC music department who sing as section leaders within the chancel choir and assist with the children's and youth music program, gaining exposure to sacred repertoire and honing skills as a church musician. In addition to a modest scholarship stipend, choral scholars have access to our sanctuary for their degree recitals and enjoy the love and support of a church community outside of their rigorous academic life. The music resident program offers an internship opportunity for a keyboardist with an interest in liturgical music. The music resident is given free room and board in the church apartment and unrestricted access to our facilities and instruments for practice.

It is the support of our generous congregation through annual pledging that continues to make both of these initiatives possible. Let's all extend a warm UPC welcome to Hania, Annie, and Ethan when they return to Chapel Hill in August!



Hania Kantzer (Music Resident) is a sophomore pursuing degrees in biochemistry and in Asian studies. While at UNC, she has been able to take part in projects at the Carolina Center for Jewish Studies as well as gaining experience in archeological research on the Huqoq Excavation Project in Israel this summer. She also recently picked up playing baroque violin in the UNC Baroque Ensemble. 
