The majority of refugees served through RSC are from Burma but also from DR Congo, Rwanda, Syria, Afghanistan, and Ukraine. The supply drive will be serving 350 Pre-K through Grade 12 students with the help of local congregations and community groups. At UPC, we invite you to bring your donations forward in worship on July 14, and we'll then transport them across the street. PW Profile: Marian Johnson

Presbyterian Women Circles are a significant part of the sisterhood of Christ within our congregation. UPC has eight Presbyterian Women's Circles. These Circles meet monthly during the program year, sharing time to nurture faith through fellowship, prayer, and Bible study. This time set apart strengthens the women in the Circles' commitment to God and encourages them to love and serve in a broken world. Some Circles have met for decades, others are still forming. Regardless of how long each Circle has been in formation, they are places of shared authenticity, laughter, sorrow, challenge, support, and wisdom.

Recently, PW Communications chair Judy Dorezas sat down with Marian Johnson, a beloved member of UPC since 1968 and a member of Circle #3 for many years. Here is what Marian shared about how being part of a PW Circle has impacted her spiritual life.

God has always been the common bond for Marian's most treasured relationships. She has a favorite verse from Scripture that guides her spiritual life and highlights the importance of sharing faith within a community: "Where two or more are gathered in my name, I will be with you" (Matthew 18:20).

At 97 years young, Marian remembers many people and events that have shaped her faith. On Sunday afternoons, her grandfather, Pop, would go to the prison to read the Bible to those incarcerated there. This act of service taught her about unconditional love, the power of forgiveness, and how hope can sustain people in the midst of despair.

When her children were young, Marian felt that women in the church needed a place to gather without other responsibilities. They needed to be able to take time away from family and gather with other Christian



women to share concerns, nurture friendships, and support each other in collective spiritual growth. To help make these gatherings possible, Marian organized and paid someone to babysit all of the children while the women could leave their mothering-duties and assemble together.

To this day, once a month, a Presbyterian Women's Circle gathers in Marian's home. They share fellowship, Bible study, prayer, snacks, laughs, tears - and the blessing that when they gather, God's presence is among them.

As you continue to learn from and grow into the meaning of your star word this summer, remember this poem, "The Summer Day" from poet Mary Oliver:

the one who has flung herself out of the grass,

the one who is eating sugar out of my hand,

who is moving her jaws back and forth instead of up and down-

who is gazing around with her enormous and complicated eyes.

Now she snaps her wings open, and floats away.

I don't know exactly what a prayer is.

I do know how to pay attention, how to fall down

into the grass, how to kneel down in the grass,

how to be idle and blessed, how to stroll through the fields,

which is what I have been doing all day.

Tell me, what else should I have done?

Doesn't everything die at last, and too soon?

Tell me, what is it you plan to do

with your one wild and precious life?
